The Dominican Republic has lots of poverty, which means lots of hungry children. In the village of Los Algodones this is the case everyday for the 120 or more children that live there. They usually eat one small meal a day at 4pm in the afternoon and that's it for the day for many of the Haitian children that live there. However, because of the school that is located in Los Algodones the children had been receiving breakfast at the school. This is a big help for the hungry children to help meet their physical and nutritional needs. However, the summer is here and the school is closed. As the school year drew to a close the Director of the Los Algodones school was telling us that the children were asking "what are we going to eat?" You see, some of the children only get fed daily because of this breakfast that they receive from the



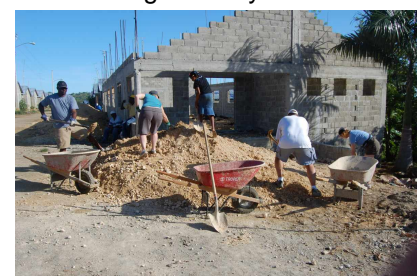

## Lakemount Church Mission Team 2009

On June 20 we received a team from Canada from Lakemount Community Church arriving at 12:30am to the airport and they were on the job site moving blocks by 10:30am. What an amazing group (**pictured below**). This group raised money to build a Sunday school building for children in the village of Paradise. They also came to help with the construction working in the 95 degree hot sun. They carried blocks, wheel barrowed, shoveled and picked the hard Caliche. The team also went to the local hospital and visited and prayed with the



patients and gave all the patients a gift. They visited the small village of Chichigua where they did a children's ministry, singing songs, reading a Bible lesson, and also giving over 50 children juice, eggs, fruit, sandwiches and a gift. On their last afternoon they went to the 27 waterfalls and had some fun climbing, swimming, hiking and jumping down the beautiful God-made waterfalls. ## *Medical Clinic Update*

Centro Medico Dr. Umbert Hart located in the village of Los Algodones has been formally open for almost 6 months now and we are blessed to see the change it is making in the surrounding communities and the lives of the people. We have given service to almost 500 people and been blessed to have aided 3 patients so far with much needed surgery, as well as dozens of others with analysis/testing. Working together with Dr. Lambert Emmanuel, our staff nurse, Maria Altagracia, other staff members and volunteers, we are able to provide medical service/assistance to the poor of the area and couple these services with the good news of a loving Savior.



This last week we had a testimony from the husband of one of surgery patients of his gratitude for helping his wife, who had been sick for many years – it gave an opportunity to explain to him that this clinic is a work of the Heavenly Father, and all the gratitude belongs to him. We are but workers in His kingdom – we have a service to render, we leave the rest up to the Lord.

### **Points Of Interest :**

- 1) We, along with some other local missionaries have started a church with a service in English and we have named it North Coast Community Church.
- 2) We continue to deliver water to Chi-chigua, a small poor Haitian and Dominican community of about 100 people.
- 3) We are delivering food once a week to a four year old girl whose mother died from AIDS. Please pray for Ana Patricia for this is a difficult time for her without her mother. Her 17 year old cousin is caring for her.
